Bay area citizens encouraged to attend public meeting on keeping Galveston Bay clean

Houston, TX – May 31, 2017 - Galveston Bay Foundation (GBF) wants Bay area residents to have a stake in keeping harmful bacteria out of Galveston Bay. That's why GBF will host a public meeting at the Civic Center in League City on Monday, June 12, at 6:30 pm to update residents on our plan to keep our waters clean.

In partnership with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and local stakeholders, GBF is working to keep bacteria out of the Bay through improving wastewater treatment plant operations, improving pollution reporting strategies, eliminating boater waste and more.

"We want the citizens who most frequently interact with the Bay to have a say in how to keep these waters free from harmful bacteria," said Nate Johnson, GBF Water Programs Manager. "Anyone interested in clean Galveston Bay waters is encouraged to attend the meeting and have an opportunity to discuss issues with GBF staff."
